

If a verb ends in an **unvoiced** sound, for example *help, laugh, reduce, wash, watch, work,* when we add *-ed* we pronounce this **/t/**.

If a verb ends with **t** or **d** sound, for example *plant*, *demand*, when we add *-ed* we pronounce this /id/ and it adds an extra syllable.
