| 1. Nomads (n.) | المهاجرين | People who travel from place to place to find fresh grasslands for their livestock. | For centuries, nomads have shepherded goats, sheep, and cattle across the country. |
| 2. Tribes (n.) | قبائل | A social division in a traditional society consisting of families or communities linked by social, economic, religious, or blood ties, with a common culture and dialect, typically having a recognized leader. | Al Qasimi and Al Shamsi are famous Emirati tribes . |
| 3. Values (n.) | مبادئ | principles and beliefs | Integrity and tolerance are some of the Islamic values that every Muslim should be attached to. |
| 4. ancient (adj.) | قديم | old; outdated | Ancient civilizations lived a very simple life |
| 5. generations (n.) | أجيال | All the people who are born and live at about the same time | Today's generation is the Y generation of technology. |
| 6. population (n.) | عدد السكان | The number of people who live in one area | China has the largest number of population in the whole world. |
| 7. industry (n.) | صناعة | An economic activity which is concerned with the processing of raw materials and the manufacture of goods in factories. | I prefer not to engage in too much industry , skipping the most grueling work whenever I can, if at all possible. |
| 8. import (v.) | يستورد | To bring (goods or services) into a country from abroad for sale. | The U.A.E imported cars from the U.K. |
| 9. export (v.) | يصدر | To send (goods or services) to another country for sale. | The U.A.E exported oil to many countries around the world. |
| 10. harsh (adj.) | قاسي | severe | The weather grew harsh , chilly and unpredictable. |
| 11. recall (v.) | يتذكر | remember | I can't recall his family's name. |
| 12. wildlife (n.) | الحياة البرية | Undomesticated animals, in deserts, forests, and plains | I am involved in the conservation of wildlife . |

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| 13.enemy(n.) | عدو | a person who hates or opposes another person and tries to harm him | He used to be my best friend, but now he's my worst enemy . |
| 14.nearby (adv.) | قريب | Close to | We built a house nearby . |
| 15.passion (n.) | شغف | a strong feeling of enthusiasm or excitement for something or about doing something. | Everyone could see the passion in his approach to the work. |
| 16.survive (v.) | ينجو / يبقى على قيد الحياة | To stay alive | He has survived several assassination attempts. |
| 17.traditions (n.) | تقاليد | a long-established custom or belief that has been passed on from one generation to another. | Falconry is one of the most famous Emirati traditions . |
| 18.hospitality (n.) | حسن الضيافة | The friendly generous reception and entertainment of guests and visitors | After visiting Ahmed, I thanked him for his hospitality . |
| 19.folklore | فلكلور | The traditional customs and stories of communities passed through generations by word of mouth | The "Yolla" dance is part of the Emirati folklore . |
| 20.greeting (n.) | ترحيب | The action of giving a sign of welcome | The Emirati people welcome their guests with a warm, long greeting . |
| 21.fable (n.) | قصة للعظة | a short tale / story, typically with animals as characters, conveying a moral | I enjoy reading Aesop's fables . |
| 22.Moral (n.) | الدرس المستفاد | the lesson that is derived from a <i>story</i> and that teaches us how to behave in life | All good stories will teach you valuable morals . |
| 23.Characters(n.) | الشخصيات | People in a novel, play, or film | I don't like evil characters in the movies. |
| 24.narrator (n.) | راوي القصة | a person who narrates a story | The narrator depicts the story using strong emotions. |
| 25.translate (v.) | يترجم | To change the words into a different language | Could you translate this word for me into Arabic? |
| 26.skyscrapers(n.) | ناطحات سحاب | A very tall building of many storeys | Burj Khalifa is the tallest skyscraper in the world. |
| 27.Luxurious (adj.) | فخم | extremely comfortable or elegant, especially when involving great expense | Burj Al Arab is the most luxurious hotel in Dubai. |
| 28.Astonishingly(adv.) | بدهشة | amazingly | Astonishingly , he survived a deadly accident. |

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| 1. landmark (n.) | معلم معروف | a location or a building that is famous and usually visited by tourists. | The Sharjah Mosque is one of the famous landmarks of Sharjah. |
| 2. resort (n.) | منتجع | a kind of hotel that usually has a beach and spa area. | Jumeirah is full of luxurious resorts . |
| 3. Geography (n.) | جغرافيا | the study of the physical features of the earth and its atmosphere, and of human activity as it affects and is affected by these, including the distribution of populations and resources and political and economic activities. | U.A.E is connected to other Gulf countries by geography , history, economics and religion. |
| 4. environment (n.) | البيئة المحيطة | the surroundings or conditions in which a person lives. | As good citizens, we have to respect our environment , our surroundings and our neighbours. |
| 5. area (n.) | مساحة | the amount of space that a place covers | The area of RAK is around 1684 km ² . |
| 6. population growth (n.) | الزيادة السكانية | an increase in the size, amount or degree of population | The population growth is decreasing by 1.4% each year. |
| 7. majority (n.) | الأغلبية | the largest part of a group of people or something. | The majority of the students got high marks on the test. |
| 8. expatriates Or expats (n.) | الوافدين | people living in a country that is not their own. | The writer, an expatriate living in <i>the U.A.E.</i> , has studied and worked in the U.S.A. |
| 9. immigration (n.) | الهجرة | the process of coming to live permanently in a country that is not your own | The process of immigration to Canada has become more difficult nowadays. |
| 10. dramatically (adv.) | بطريقة مفاجئة | suddenly | The number of deaths has increased dramatically . |
| 11. slightly (adv.) | قليلا | Little | The new house is slightly smaller Than the old one. |
| 12. double (v.) | تضاعف | to become or make something become twice as much or as many. | His money doubled in three years |
| 13. significant (adj.) | ملاحظ | can be noticed | I have noticed a significant improvement in Teddy's attitude since you talked with him. |
| 14. gender gap (n.) | الفجوة بين الذكور والاناث | The big difference between the percentage of male and female | The gender gap in literacy is shrinking in the U.A.E. |
| 15. narrow (v.) | يضيق | To become smaller | The road narrows after the bridge. |
| 16. make up (v.) | يشكل | To form or be part of something | The Earth is made up of many layers. |

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| 17.Bar Chart (n.) | رسم بياني بالأعمدة | a diagram in which the numerical values of variables are represented by the height or length of lines or rectangles of equal width. | The bar chart shows sales on the left and the cost of sales on the right. |
| 18.pie chart (n.) | رسم بياني دوائر | A type of graph in which a circle is divided into sectors representing a proportion of the whole | The pie chart shows how the public money is spent. |
| 19.line graph (n.) | رسم بياني خطي | a graph that uses lines to connect individual data points | The major advantage of the line graph is that it is easy to analyse the relationship between variables. |
| 20.Education (n.) | التعليم | The process of receiving or giving systematic instruction, especially at a school or university | The school is devoted to the education of children with reading difficulties. |
| 21.kindergarten (n.) | الروضة | an establishment where children below the age of compulsory education play and learn; a nursery school. | My son is reluctant to go to the kindergarten . |
| 22.elementary education (n.) | المرحلة الأساسية | School grades from grade 1 to grade 5 | He earned his bachelor's degree in elementary education . |
| 23.secondary education (n.) | المرحلة الثانوية | School grades from grade 9 to grade 12 | These examinations are taken after five years of secondary education . |
| 24.tertiary (n.) | المرحلة الجامعية | Education after secondary | Tertiary education follows secondary education. |
| 25.satellite campus (n.) | حرم جامعي في دولة مختلفة عن مكان الجامعة الاصلية | A university campus set in a different country or city to the main university building. | There are four satellite campuses in the surrounding area. |
| 26.highly ranked (adj.) | مصنف عالي | An organization or person in a high position. | The university is highly ranked among its peers. |
| 27.postgraduate (adj.) | الشهادة العليا بعد البكالوريوس | the range of higher degrees past the undergraduate degree | After college, she spent her first postgraduate year studying abroad. |
| 28.curriculum (n.) | المنهاج الدراسي | the subjects comprising a course of study in a school or college. | He is studying English at an American curriculum school. |
| 29.staff (n.) | طاقم العمل | all the people employed by a particular organization employees/ workers | The manager thanked his staff for their outstanding performance. |
| 30.get promoted (v.) | يحصل على ترقية | to raise someone to a higher or more important position or rank | He managed to get himself promoted last week. |
| 31.perks (n.) | بدالات | something extra you get, in addition to a salary, in exchange for working. | Perks include staff discounts and bonuses for managers |
| 32. equipment (n.) | أدوات | the necessary items for a particular purpose | We will supply you with all the training and equipment you need. |
| 33.apply (v.) | يقدم طلب وظيفة | make a formal application or request. | You need to apply to the local authority for a grant. |

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| 34.day off (n.) | يوم إجازة | A 24-hour break from work | She's taking three days off next week. |
| 35.induction (n.) | لقاء تدريبي | A training you do at the start of a new job | New employees will undergo an induction which will last a month. |
| 36.colleagues(n.) | زملاء | the people you work with | She thanked her colleagues for their work this year. |
| 37.salary (n.) | راتب | the money you receive every month for doing your job | The lawyer was paid a huge salary . |
| 38.target (n.) | هدف | Goal or aim | We failed to reach this month's sales' targets . |
| 39.tax free (adj.) | بلا ضرائب | certain types of goods, earnings and financial securities (that are not taxed) | In future, company employees will be allowed one tax-free mobile. |
| 40.integrated (adj.) | مترابط | Linked or combined | Colorful illustrations are integrated into the text. |
| 41.commute (v.) | يتنقل | Travel some distance between one's home and place of work regularly. | One Monday morning I set off on my daily commute to work. |
| 42.traffic jam (n.) | أزمة مرورية | Traffic congestion | He told me that he was caught in a traffic jam . |
| 43.automated (adj.) | تعمل بتشغيل الي | operated by largely automatic equipment | This is the world's most fully automated office building. |
| 44.Congestion (n.) | أزمة مرورية | A situation in which a place is too blocked or crowded, causing difficulties. | The new bridge should ease congestion in the area. |
| 45.rush hour (n.) | وقت الذروة | A time during each day when traffic is at its heaviest. | Try to avoid travelling in the rush hour . |
| 46.freight (n.) | شحن | Goods transported in bulk by truck, train, ship, or aircraft. | They shipped goods by air freight . |
| 47.Tram (n.) | قطار كهربائي | A passenger vehicle powered by electricity conveyed by overhead cables and running on rails laid on a public road. | I took a tram to the city centre. |
| 48.stressful (adj.) | تحت الضغط | Causing mental or emotional stress | His new job is so stressful . |
| 49.range (n.) | سلسلة | Several mountains in a continuous line. | A range of mountains separates the two countries. |
| 50.shrub (n.) | شجيرة | A low plant like a small tree. | Hundreds of trees and shrubs will be planted at the park during December. |
| 51.gorge (n.) | سهل | A deep space with high sides between the mountains. | It was dark and damp at the bottom of the gorge . |
| 52.moor(n.) | أرض غير صالحة للزراعة | A wide area of land with bushes, not used for farming. | We went for a walk on the moor . |
| 53.peak (n.) | قمة | The pointed top of a mountain | He climbed his last Swiss peak at the age of 80. |

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| 54.marsh (n.) | سبخة | Wet ground, usually with tall grass growing in it. | Farmers simply saw the marsh as unproductive land that could be used for grazing animals. |
| 55.valley (n.) | وادي | A low stretch of land between hills. | We stood on a plateau overlooking the valley . |
| 56.coast (n.) | ساحل | The edge of the land where it meets the sea. | They sailed around the west coast of the U.A.E. |
| 57.dune (n.) | كثبان رملية | A hill of sand created by the wind. | The sand massed to form a dune . |
| 58.forest (n.) | غابة | An area of land dominated by trees. | The coastal plain was bordered by a dense forest . |
| 59.cave (n.) | كهف | A natural void in the ground, specifically a space large enough for a human to enter. | There is water in the interior of the cave . |
