Reading Part 2
Alternative Energy Now!

Alternative Energy Now! is being released to encourage global leaders to do more to tackle complex factors, such as overpopulation of urban developments, which are resulting in rising temperatures. The documentary looks at the alternative energy sources that are being employed by nations in order to battle the climate crisis and focuses mainly on the countries which are more interested in making real change than others. One of the most concerning aspects of the documentary is that a report stated some of those global positions speak positively for change and share their innovative ideas during global climate meeting. However, when it comes to implementing these projects, they do very little. What shocked me the most was the report that suggested if countries had, in fact, studied the data in the early nineties when concerns were raised, we would have a much more positive outlook today. Spoiler alert: Experts predict a frightening future.

The documentary explains how wind energy is thought to be among the best cleanest energy sources because it has little negative impact on the environment, and therefore, reduces the reliance on sources that create fossil fuels. In China and the US, wind turbines are being replaced in coastal regions, open plains, and mountain areas, making them a constant source of energy from the continuing high winds. The turbines gather through air in motion and use it to generate electricity.

More good news! Roofs are being replaced with greener options across American cities to combat rising temperatures. In 2001, Chicago covered 20.000 square feet of its city hall roof with vegetation. It was reported to have made a 50-degree difference in temperature to the building, which resulted in a reduction in cooling and heating costs and overall energy demand in comparison to a nearby tar roof building.

Solar power is believed to be more popular with individual households today than other energy sources. This might be because it was reported by a European government that installing the panels can also make homes more cost efficient. Although solar panels are easily accessible, meaning people can take more control of their energy use rather than relying on large scale government projects such as wind farms, they are extremely costly and only produce energy for half the day due to reliance on sunlight.

A Business that Truly Delivers

In 2004, Talabat was launched by its creators in Kuwait. When the company began, the focus was on creating partnerships with restaurants by providing delivery services to get food to customers within the country. Delivery services were only available during the hours that restaurants in Kuwait were open. A customer would order their food online and Talabat's customer care employees would call the restaurant and place the order for the customer. Then the delivery driver was sent to the restaurant to pick up the order and deliver it to the customer.

In contrast to when the company began in 2004, Talabat has become the largest food delivery service in the Middle East and North Africa after the company was purchased by Delivery Hero. Talabat now offers a delivery service for groceries, flowers, and items from pharmacies. They have introduced a 24-hour grocery delivery service that guarantees delivery in 30 minutes or less.

By the end of the first 3 years under the ownership of Delivery hero, Talabat had hired a new CEO. Before working for Talabat Tomaso Rodriguez had worked at food delivery businesses in Europe and Asia. Rodriguez hopes to create communities experience moments that matter through apps and online tools. Starting a unified food-delivery service, so as to put people's happiness and satisfaction the center of its business.

By the end of summer of 2023, Rodriguez had worked as if he were a delivery driver for several days to discover issues that impact employees and customers. He decided to do this during the summer months so that he could experience delivery drivers' conditions in peak temperatures. Rodriguez discovered that the summer heat was not a problem while riding the motorbike; however, when stopped at traffic lights or waiting to pick up deliveries the heat became extreme. In response to this issue, not only did Talabat provide air-conditioned buses for drivers use between deliveries, but they also added UV windshields to their motorbikes. This way drivers will experience a cooler ride. Rodriguez is seeking solutions for drivers' issues with parking and access to buildings which will improve service for customers.

As the leader of a company, Rodriguez believes that there are issues that statistics and data cannot reveal. If he had not volunteered to become a delivery driver he probably would have been unaware of the issues they face every day. He plans to go undercover again in the future to regularly to learn and implement solutions to improve both drivers and customers' experiences.

On August 3, 1492, Christopher Columbus set sail from Palos, Spain, with less than a hundred crew members to discover a new route to Asia. After spending a difficult time at sea, the party sighted land early on the morning of October 12, 1492. They set foot on an island in the Bahamas which they named Al Salvador. Columbus presumed that the indigenous people were Native Indians as he was under the mistaken belief that he had set foot on Indian soil. Probably some 10 million American Indians were natives to the land before the large-scale inhabitation by Europeans and subsequent annihilation of Native Americans started.

However, it took more than a hundred years after Columbus discovered America for the Europeans to finally take the momentous decision to make the New World their home.

The Native Americans actually welcomed the pale-skinned visitors primarily out of curiosity than anything else. They were fascinated by the steel knives and swords, fire spewing cannons, brass and copper utensils, etc. that these visitors brought with them. Eventually, cultural differences erupted. The natives could not stomach the arrogance of the newcomers and the scant respect they paid to nature. The European settlers viewed every resource — plants, animals, and people as something to be commercially exploited.

The native Indians were vastly outnumbered in the wars that ensued. The resistance they put up never proved enough to stop the European settlers. The nomadic lifestyle of the Indians, the relatively unsophisticated weapons at their disposal, the unwillingness of some of their own people to defend themselves, and the diseases of the white men — all contributed to the virtual elimination of their race. Some of the diseases brought by Europeans from their overcrowded cities that decimated the natives were: small pox, plague, measles, cholera, typhoid, and malaria. These deadly diseases, to which most natives had developed no resistance, devastated many tribes between 1775 and 1850.

- 1- Analyze the question and understand it well before starting planning.
- 2- If you are asked to write an essay, you should write in separate paragraphs.
- 3- Make your introduction to-the-point and concise. Keep in mind that you are paving the way to the topic and you are only introducing the topic to the reader. Do not spend too much in the introduction.
- 4- Using proper linkers and transitional phrases are essential to ensure that your piece of writing is cohesive and coherent.
- 5- After finishing your piece of writing, it's recommended to proofread it trying to correct your mistakes.
- 6 Always start the sentences with a capital letter and end them with the proper end marks.
- 7- Vary sentences length by incorporating simple, compound, complex and compound-complex sentences into your writing.

Sentence starters, linking words, transitional phrases

Using linking words within and between sentences and paragraphs helps to make your writing flow logically. These words act as signposts, assisting your reader to move easily from one idea to the next, and to see relationships between sentences or paragraphs. Linking words are particularly useful for indicating that you are going to explain something, to give an example or to use a time sequence, or to offer a contrasting view.
