### **Overview**

In this assessment planner, you will find all of the tools and information you need to plan and implement Term 2 assessments. While every effort has been made to provide complete and accurate information in this document, there is a possibility that elements of the assessment plan will be updated as the term progresses. If the need arises, updates will be communicated as soon as the assessment team is aware of the change and an updated version of this document will be provided.

#### **Level Alignments**

Level alignments allow you to access and understand targeted learning outcomes and assessment goals for your students. Level alignments include the National English Language Curriculum (NELCF) Level, the Literacy Level, the CEFR Level, the Lexile Range, a list of National and International Assessments, and a list of assessed curriculum frameworks.

#### Coverage

Coverage details are of particular importance in planning instruction for the term. In order to ensure that students are fully prepared for assessments, ensure frequent exposure to Term 2 assessment topics, lexis, grammar and functional language found in **this** document. Coverage may differ from what is featured in the course books. The Literacy and Humanities Assessment Unit will provide resources to support you and your students in preparing for assessments. A supporting slideshow with examples of Term 2 grammatical points and structures will be released in Week 1 to provide support for all Term 2 assessments. An additional slideshow will be released ahead of the Listening Task and the Listening Summative Assessment. This is for classroom use and will contain information about key lexis and functional language. You will have the opportunity to build background knowledge and ensure comprehension of assessment content for the Speaking Outcome Tracker during regular instruction. We recommend using the information in the coverage details to develop your own resources to provide additional exposure to assessed topics and language points throughout the term.

#### **Term 2 Assessments**

In Term 2 Assessments, you will find a list of all assessments for the term including the assessment type, weights for the term and the academic year, pacing, release dates and due dates, and a brief description of each assessment.

#### **Assessment Timeline**

The assessment timeline provides a visual representation of the assessment plan for Term 2. It details when assessments are to be completed and marked, and also provides release information for all resources and assessment tools.

#### **Specifications and Guidance**

Guidance will be provided ahead of implementation and all specifications are included in the document. The specifications and guidance are similar to the documents released by the assessment team in previous years, with some updates to formatting and content for cohesion and to reflect changes to the assessment plan for the current academic year. Specifications and guidance are provided for the Listening Task, the Speaking Outcome Tracker and the Listening Summative Assessment.



Assessment	Description		
Listening Task	The listening task is an engaging activity that allows students to show their understanding of what they heard through a written response. Audio texts are simple, short and comprehension is supported by images and vocabulary provided in a PowerPoint presentation. The text from the listening task will be discussed by students in their end of term speaking exam.		
Speaking Outcome Tracker	The Speaking Outcome Tracker provides a clear and easy to use assessment tool based on the different Learning Outcomes. The students' oral language abilities are assessed formatively in class using an activity or activities that the teacher chooses as part of regular classroom instruction.		
Listening Summative Assessment	As the culmination of the term's work, students are asked to demonstrate their learning by answering 15 multiple choice questions about two listening texts. There will be 7 questions in Part 1 and 8 questions in Part 2. In Part 1 of the listening exam, students will listen to the second part of the story that they heard in the continuous assessment Listening Task. Part 2 of the exam will consist of an information text related to the topic in the coverage document.
