Have you ever been in a hot air balloon? Would you like to?

Well ... that's an interesting question. I've never tried such a wonderful (hair-raising) adventure, but I'd love to. Although it might seem a dangerous experience, I guess, it would be great. But, unfortunately, I don't think this dream can be easily achieved, at least in the near future, as keeping a social distance would not be that easy inside such a small basket space. So, I have to wait until the covid-19 pandemic is over to go for an exciting hot air balloon ride.

What do you think are the perfect weather conditions for a hot air balloon ride?

Well ... that's a tricky question. Let me think for a moment, please... Well ... there must be a cool temperature for air ballooning. When heated to a certain degree, the air inside the balloon expands, and becomes lighter than the air surrounding it. This makes it lift and float through the air moving up into the sky. If the air surrounding the balloon is too warm, it won't be able to rise. So, I think the best time of the day for a perfect safe ride would be early in the morning, when there is a light wind. There are also some other weather features to consider, such as visibility, wind speed and possibility of rain or storms.

What is the most extreme weather you have ever experienced?

I've got tones of (a lot of) stories to tell about (I've been exposed to many) bad weather conditions I've experienced (I've seen), but I'll talk about a foggy day I'll never forget (that can't be easily forgotten). It was a Saturday, late at night, something around 11.30 while I was coming back home from Ras Al Khaimah with my family in our car. see the other cars or any other objects on the road. It was as if a blanket of fog had covered everything. Unfortunately, we had to stop our car by the road. We had to spend about 7 hours sleeping inside it before the fog started to disappear at about 8 in the morning. While driving on the road, we saw some traffic accidents that had been made because of that dense fog. Of course, we went back home completely exhausted, and couldn't do anything that day. This was the worst weather condition I've ever seen.

Which countries do you think have the worst weather?

Well ... I've googled this question once and found that there are three countries which are thought to have the worst weather. These are Japan, the Philippines and Germany which were hit by the hardest weather extremes.

What is the weather like in your hometown/the UAE?
