

The rainforest is about life. Rain forests are wooded areas that receive more than 78 inches of rainfall a year and have temperatures that never reach freezing; the ecosystem that houses the largest amount of biodiversity on the planet.

Importance of the Rainforest

The role of the rainforest transcends scientific definitions. Even though only 7% of the world's original rain forests remain, more than half of the planet's species still live there. This wealth of life benefits us every day. Scientists are constantly discovering new uses for endemic plants, including many breakthrough drugs, while still less than one percent of the world's rainforest have been explored for pharmaceutical properties.

Simply put, rainforests are the Earth's lungs. Through photosynthesis, they pull carbon out of the atmosphere (storing it in the roots, stems, leaves and branches of the plants) and transform it into life-giving oxygen while at the same time

The wholesale destruction of rain forests is directly responsible for the current buildup of carbon in our atmosphere. Rainforests also keep our planet cool by combating the effects of the greenhouse effect.

Additionally many food items you enjoy every day originally came from rainforest across the globe. Coffee, several kinds of nuts, and scores of fruits and spices grew naturally in rainforests before humans cultivated them as crops.

Due to deforestation, some 100 species will become extinct every day – many of them are still undiscovered and their qualities will be lost forever. We at the Rainforest Adventures are fighting to reverse this trend.



The **Nile** (Arabic: النيل, Egyptian Arabic *en-Nīl*, Standard Arabic *an-Nīl*; Coptic: ⲛⲓⲗ, *P(h)iaro*; Ancient Egyptian: *'pī* and *Iteru*; Biblical Hebrew: יַאֲרוֹ, *Ye'or*) is a major north-flowing river in northeastern Africa. It is generally regarded as the longest river in the world,^[2] however other conflicting sources cite a 2007 study that gave the title to the Amazon River in South America.^[3] The Nile, which is 6,853 km (4,258 miles) long, is an "international" river as its drainage basin covers eleven countries, namely, Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Congo-Kinshasa, Kenya, Ethiopia, Eritrea, South Sudan, Sudan and Egypt.^[4] In particular, the Nile is the primary water source of Egypt and Sudan.^[5]

The Nile has two major **tributaries**, the **White Nile** and **Blue Nile**. The White Nile is considered to be the **headwaters** and primary stream of the Nile itself. The Blue Nile, however, is the source of most of the **water** and **silt**. The White Nile is longer and rises in the **Great Lakes** region of central Africa, with the most distant source still undetermined but located in either Rwanda or Burundi. It flows north through Tanzania, **Lake Victoria**, Uganda and South Sudan. The Blue Nile (**Amharic**: ዓባይ?, *Ābay*^{[6][7]}) begins at **Lake Tana** in Ethiopia^[8] and flows into Sudan from the southeast. The two rivers meet just north of the Sudanese capital of **Khartoum**.

The northern section of the river flows north almost entirely through the Sudanese [desert](#) to Egypt, then ends in a [large delta](#) and flows into the [Mediterranean Sea](#). [Egyptian civilization](#) and [Sudanese kingdoms](#) have depended on the river since ancient times. Most of the population and cities of Egypt lie along those parts of the Nile valley north of [Aswan](#), and nearly all the cultural and historical sites of [Ancient Egypt](#) are found along riverbanks.

In the ancient [Egyptian language](#), the Nile is called *'pī* or *Iteru* (Hapy), meaning "river". In [Coptic](#), the words *piaro* ([Sahidic](#)) or *phiaro* ([Bohairic](#)) meaning "the river" (lit. p(h).iar-o "the.canal-great") come from the same ancient name.

The English name *Nile* and the Arabic names *en-Nîl* and *an-Nîl* both derive from the [Latin](#) *Nilus* and the [Ancient Greek](#) [Νε λος](#).^{[9][10]} Beyond that, however, the etymology is disputed.^{[10][11]} One possible etymology derives it from a [Semitic](#) *Nahal*, meaning "river".^[12] The standard English names "White Nile" and "Blue Nile", to refer to the river's source, derive from [Arabic](#) names formerly applied only to the Sudanese stretches which meet at Khartoum.^[13]

Traditionally, an **Islamic garden** is a cool place of rest and reflection, and a reminder of [paradise](#). The [Qur'an](#) has many references to gardens, and the garden is used as an earthly analogue for the life in paradise which is promised to believers:

Unlike English gardens, which are often designed for walking, Islamic gardens are intended for rest and contemplation. For this reason, Islamic gardens usually include places for sitting.

A **gadget** is a small^[1] **tool** such as a **machine** that has a particular function, and is related to today's fast-advancing modern age **technology** to create such gadgets. Gizmos in particular are a bit different from gadgets.^[citation needed] Gadgets in particular are small tools powered by electronic principles (a circuit board).

The origins of the word "gadget" trace back to the 19th century. According to the [Oxford English Dictionary](#), there is

the [Oxford English Dictionary](#), there is anecdotal (not necessarily true) evidence for the use of "gadget" as a [placeholder name](#) for a technical item whose precise name one can't remember since the 1850s; with Robert Brown's 1886 book *Spunyarn and Spindrift, A sailor boy's log of a voyage out and home in a China tea-clipper* containing the earliest known usage in print.^[2] The etymology of the word is disputed.

A widely circulated story holds that the word gadget was "invented" when Gaget, Gauthier & Cie, the company behind the [repoussé](#) construction of the [Statue of Liberty](#) (1886), made a small-scale version of the monument and named it after their firm; however this

[Statue of Liberty](#) (1886), made a small-scale version of the monument and named it after their firm; however this contradicts the evidence that the word was already used before in nautical circles, and the fact that it did not become popular, at least in the USA, until after World War I.^[2] Other sources cite a derivation from the French *gâchette* which has been applied to various pieces of a firing mechanism, or the French *gagée*, a small tool or accessory.^[2]
