Traditions of the UAE

Desert oasis tools are a travel company that introduces overseas tourists to some of the traditions of the UAE. First Emirati hospitality is shown to guests by serving them coffee which is poured from a tall coffee pot into small cups. The coffee pot is always made of metal and is sometimes decorated with images and designs. The visitors are also able to learn how to make Arabic coffee.

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Grammar Review

The Past Simple

The simple past is a verb tense that is used to talk about things that happened before now.

We use the past tense to talk about:

- something that happened once in the past:

I met my Adel Immam in 2005.
We went to Spain for our holidays.
They got home very late last night.

- something that happened several times in the past:

When I was a boy, I walked a mile to school every day.
We swam a lot while we were on holiday.
They always enjoyed visiting their friends.

- something that was true for some time in the past:

I lived abroad for three years.
He enjoyed being a footballer.
She played a lot of tennis when she was younger.

Past simple questions and negatives

We use *did* to make **questions** with the past simple:

Did she play tennis when she was younger?
Did you live abroad?
When did he meet his wife?
Where did you go for your holidays?

But questions with *who* often don't use *did*:

Who discovered penicillin?
who called you last night?

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We use didn't (did not) to make **negatives** with the past simple:

They didn't go to Spain this year.
We didn't get home until very late last night.
I didn't see you yesterday.

Second conditional If

The second conditional uses the **past simple** after if, then 'would or could and the infinitive:

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- **if + past simple, ...would + infinitive**

Examples

If it rained, you would get wet.

You would get wet if it rained.

If you went to bed earlier you wouldn't be so tired.

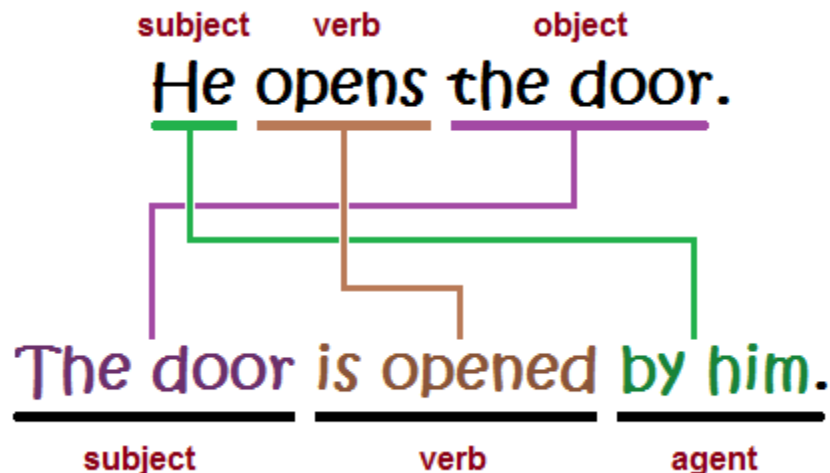

Present Simple Passive structure

Let's compare active and passive structures in Present Simple.



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The Present Simple Active is formed like this:

To make statements with the Present Simple Passive, use:

am/is/are + the Past Participle form of the verb

Examples

1. We **write** a paragraph every day.

A paragraph **is written** every day.

2. We **watch a movie** on Friday.

A movie **is watched** on Friday.

3. Ali **doesn't eat** fish.

Fish **is not eaten**.

4. My mother **makes** food for us.

Food **is made** for us.

The present Perfect tense

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The present perfect is used to describe

1. An action or situation that started in the past and continues in the present. ...
2. An action performed during a period that has not yet finished. ...
3. A repeated action in an unspecified period between the past and now.

Actions started in the past and continuing in the present

- They *haven't lived* here for years.
- She *has worked* in the bank for five years.
- We *have had* the same car for ten years.
- *Have you played* the piano since you were a child?

Actions repeated in an unspecified period between the past and now.

- They *have seen* that film six times
- It *has happened* several times already.
- She *has visited* them frequently.
- We *have eaten* at that restaurant many times.

Actions completed in the very recent past (+just)

- *Have you just finished* work?
- I *have just eaten*.
- We *have just seen* her.
- *Has he just left*?

When the precise time of the action is not important or not known

- Someone *has eaten my fruit* !
- *Have you seen* Titanic?
- *She's studied* Japanese, Russian, and English.

Forming the present perfect

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Have / has + PP

I have studied English.

My brother has bought a new iphone.
