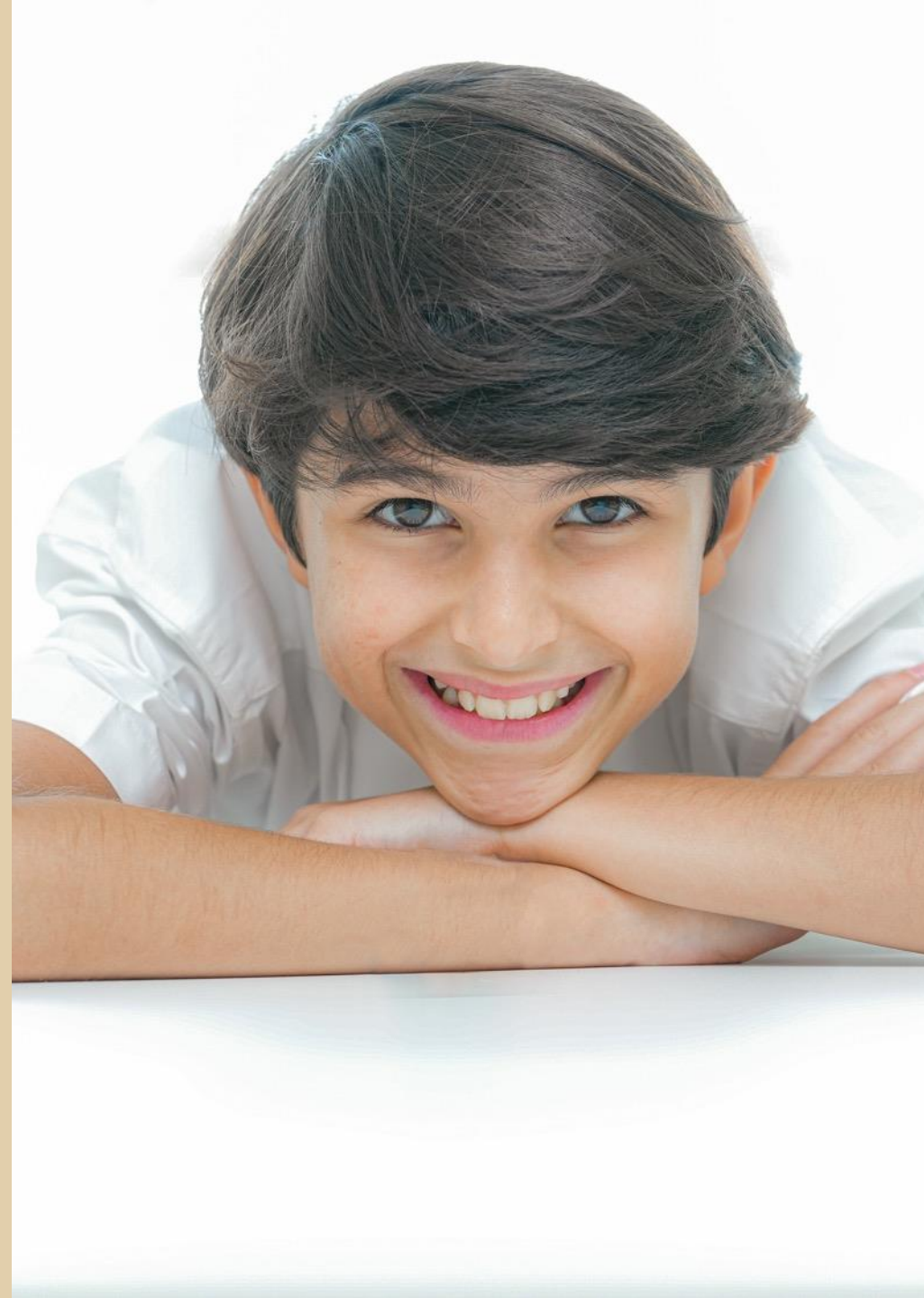

Checking questions	Which robot won the competition? In the sentence 'The robot won the competition' do we know which robot the speaker is talking about?
Grammatical structure	<u>Clauses and phrases: defining relative clauses</u> Subject + who/which/that + defining clause
Usage	Defining (restrictive) relative clauses are used to give us essential information about the person or thing being mentioned in the sentence. Without it, there is not enough information and we don't know who or what is being spoken about. We use relative pronouns (who / that) to talk about people and (which / that) to talk about things.
Other examples	Sarah is the only student <u>who stayed calm and confident</u> during the competition. The headphones <u>which I bought yesterday</u> are not working properly. The camel <u>which won Al-Wathba camel race</u> was my grandfather's.

If Salem went abroad, he would go to the UK. His sister lives there.

Checking questions	Is Salem going abroad? Is this a real situation? Is it impossible or unlikely?
Grammatical structure	<u>Conditional: second conditional</u> 'if' clause / condition in past simple, + subject + 'would / could' + infinitive + rest of sentence subject + 'would / could' + infinitive + rest of clause + 'if' clause / condition in past simple
Usage	The second conditional can be used to describe a hypothetical present or future situation. It is used to talk about situations that are unlikely. In the example above, it is unlikely that Salem will go abroad. In the second conditional, we can choose whether to have the 'if' clause first or second. When the 'if' clause comes after the 'would / could' clause, there is no comma between clauses.
Other examples	If shopping centers <u>used</u> robots, the checkout process <u>would be</u> faster. If I <u>had</u> a robot that helps with housework, I <u>would save</u> so much time. Hamad <u>would feel</u> more confident about his presentation if he <u>practised</u> more.

My father: “Could you use your headphones to listen to podcasts?”
My father asked me to use my headphones to listen to podcasts.

Checking questions	What did my father ask me to do? In the second sentence,
Grammatical structure	<u>Reported speech: reported statements</u> Subject + ‘told / asked’ + object + ‘to’ infinitive + rest of sentence ‘Did’ + subject + ‘tell / ask’ + object + ‘to’ infinitive + rest of sentence?
Usage	We use ‘told’ or ‘asked’ to report orders, instructions or requests that someone has given. We use ‘told’ for orders and instructions and ‘asked’ for requests. When we report orders or requests, we use a personal object to indicate who the order or request was given to and the infinitive of the verb with ‘to’.
Other examples	The exhibition manager <u>told us not to touch</u> the paintings. <u>Did you ask them to fix</u> those headsets for you? I <u>asked her to return</u> the book next week. He <u>told me to get</u> a new bag because mine was broken.

We know that Reem's watch is her favourite possession. It was a gift from her grandmother.

Grammatical structure

Reported speech: reported statements
Subject + 'know (that)' + rest of sentence

Usage

We can use 'know (that)' in place of 'said that' in reported speech to say that we are aware about a fact, a situation or an idea. The word 'that' is optional before the complement clause, especially in informal contexts. When we create sentences using 'know that' and present simple, it is not always necessary to backshift the sentence tense.

Other examples

They know that they have an exam at the end of term.
I didn't know that she was competing in the horse riding event. What a surprise!
Did you know that being confident is key to success?

**Would you like to know how much a new set of wireless headphones costs?
I would like to know when the next bus is.**

Checking questions	Is this question direct or polite? What words does he/she use to be polite and indirect?
Grammatical structure	<u>Reported speech: reported questions</u> subject + 'would like to know' + wh- pronoun + complement would (you) like to know + wh- pronoun + complement?
Usage	Indirect questions are a more polite way to ask for information about something or make requests. They are often used in a professional or formal setting when we don't know the person very well. Using 'would like to know' at the beginning of questions with wh- pronouns (who, what, when, where, why, how) makes them sound indirect, more polite and formal.
Other examples	<u>I'd like to know where</u> I can buy local products. <u>Would you like to know how much</u> entry tickets to the exhibition cost? He <u>would like to know where</u> the library is.

Hind asked me when I was going to the science exhibition in Abu Dhabi.

Checking questions	Who asked the question, Hind or the speaker?
Grammatical structure	<u>Reported speech: reported questions</u> subject + asked + object + wh- pronoun + rest of sentence
Usage	We use reported questions when we tell someone what another person asked. We can report wh- questions (who / what / when / where / why / how) by using a reporting verb (asked). Because it is an indirect question, we do not use a question mark, instead a full stop is used as the question is being 'reported'. When we report past wh- questions, we need to use reporting verbs such as "asked" or "wondered" and 'backshift' the verb tense one step into the past. For example, the direct question is: "Where is the book?" To report this question, we backshift the verb tense one step into the past: She asked me where the book was.
Other examples	My best friends <u>asked me how</u> I felt about going to study in Germany. I <u>wondered how long</u> the robots would be displayed at the exhibition. She <u>wondered when</u> the library closed.

Khadija has participated in many art exhibitions. She must be talented.
 Rick mustn't visit the exhibition without his parents' permission.
 The school might provide extra support for grade 9 students in English and maths.

<p>Checking questions</p>	<p>What conclusion does the speaker make about Khadija? What is it based on? Is it OK for Rick to go the exhibition? What does Rick need to attend the exhibition? Is the speaker sure the school will give extra support for grade 9 students in English and maths?</p>
<p>Grammatical structure</p>	<p><u>Modals: present modals</u> Subject + (must / can't / mustn't / may...) + infinitive</p>
<p>Usage</p>	<p>We use modal verbs before an infinitive (base form of the verb) for a variety of functions. 'Must' and 'can't' are used to make a strong inference or assumption in the present based on evidence (facts or logic). 'Mustn't' is used to express prohibition in the present and near future. 'May / might / could' are used to talk about possibilities and speculations about the future.</p>
<p>Other examples</p>	<p>He was selected to take part in a national robotics exhibition. He <u>must be</u> proud of himself. Your cousin <u>can't be</u> over 30. His youthful appearance makes him look much younger. He <u>mustn't compete</u> before having a check-up. He <u>could become</u> a better driver if he stays calm and pays closer attention to the rules. He <u>might feel</u> more confident during the race if he gets more support from his teammates.</p>
