We should write 4 paragraphs, and about 200/250 words.

5. What is a model exam question about writing a compare contrast essay?

Write a compare contrast essay about two cities in Bahrain. You can include some characteristics of each city like location, climate, population, size, historical background, education, healthcare, security, culture, diversity, tourism, quality of life, Infrastructure, major industries etc.

. Which is easier for students: the block method or the point-by-point method?

The black method of writing a compare-contrast essay is easier because after the introduction in body paragraph one, the writer lists all the similarities. Then. in body paragraph two, the writer lists all the differences, then he writes the conclusion. However, in the point-by-point method, the writer mentions the first point of similarity and contrast it with the first point of contrast. Then he mentions the second point of similarities and contrast it with the second point of contrast answer on. That is of course more difficult, and you are free to choose any method (style) of them.

7. What is the format (layout/structure) of writing a compare contrast essay. =

The layout of writing a compare contrast essay

Title:

- 1. <u>Introduction:</u> we write 3, 4, or 5 sentences. We start with a topic sentence to introduce the main idea of the essay. Then, we add one or two supporting sentences about the topic, and finally we add the thesis sentence that shows how to organise the essay.
- 2. <u>Body paragraph (1)</u>: we write 4, or 5 sentences about some similarities between the two items with some details, explanation or examples.
- 3. <u>Body paragraph (2)</u>: we write 4, or 5 sentences about some differences between the two items with some details, explanation or examples.

4.	Conclusion : we summarise the main ideas in the essay (similarities and differences)
	and we give the writer's opinion: a final comment of thought about the topic.

1. What is the writing topic of unit three?

It is writing a review about a product or service.

2. What is meant by a review about a product?

It is an article in which we describe a product or a service giving some background information about it, some positive and negative features (points), and conclusion including our overall opinion and recommendation.

9. What is a model exam question about writing a review about a product or a service?

Write a review of a product you have purchased or a service that you have used. Include some background information about it, some positive features, some other negative features, and finally Give your opinion and recommendation about it.

The layout of writing a review about a product or a service

The logical order should be as follows: (A review of) = (title)

- 1. <u>Introduction: we write 3, 4 or 5 sentence</u>. We mention and describe what we are reviewing (a product or a service). Then, we add one or two supporting sentences giving some background information about it (them) like how we knew about it (Online, from a friend, or from an advert), when we bought it, where we bought the product or have the service, end why. Then, we add I want overall view or feeling about it (them).
- 2. <u>Body paragraph (1): we write 4 or 5</u> sentences about 2 or 3 strengths (good or positive features/points) with examples about the product or service like:

Point one + detail / point two + detail / point three + detail.

3. <u>Body paragraph (2): we write 4 or 5</u> sentences about 2 or 3 weaknesses (bad or negative features/points) with examples about the product or service like:

Point one + detail / point two + detail / point three + detail.

4. <u>Conclusion: we write 3, 4 or 5 sentences.</u> We state our overall opinion about the product or service, and we give recommendation for people to buy it or not and why.
