1. According to a 2017 report from McKinsey Global Institute, between 400 million and 800 million people could lose their jobs by 2030. McKinsey predicts that as technology improves, some tasks will be done more quickly or cheaply by machine, so businesses will install robots or computer programs to do them. That means there will be less work for human employees. Many people could lose their jobs or have trouble finding new ones. "There's going to be a big disruption in the next 10 or 20 years," says Martin Ford. He is an author and futurist: He studies trends and makes predictions about the future.

- 2. Some jobs are more likely to be automated* than others. Machines can do jobs that have three characteristics: They are routine, predictable and repetitive "It's the kind of job where you come to work and work on the same kind of thing again and again," Ford says. "What you do each day is not too different from what you've done in the past." According to the McKinsey report, some of these jobs pay low wages and require little education. But others pay well and demand an advanced college degree. Taxi drivers, cashiers, lawyers, and doctors all perform some tasks that can be done by machines.
- 3. So what jobs are safe from automation? The answer is; "Anything where you're thinking outside the box and coming up with new ideas," Ford says. "Or work that involves interacting with other people, having empathy, and building relationships." Jobs like engineer, scientist, artist, therapist*, and nurse are examples.
- **4.** At Creator, the world's first entirely robot-crafted burger company, the CEO Vardakostas **hired** people to do just that kind of work. Instead of repetitive burger prepping, workers perform tasks that cannot be done by the machine. They **interact** with customers and advise them on flavor pairings, like mushroom sauce with pickles and onion jam. "In our world at Creator, all the work is creative and social," Vardakostas says. "And I think that is what we're going to see more of in the future."

Sophia is a female social humanoid robot created by Hanson Robotics company. She was officially activated in February 2016. Sophia is a very special Robot. She could communicate feelings, interact with people using more than 70 facial expressions like humans, and mimic human-like gestures.

Sofia first appeared in March 2016 at South by Southwest technology festival in Texas. Since then, Sophia has been covered by media around the world, and has participated in many interviews. In October 2017, Sophia was granted Saudi Arabian citizenship, in Future Investment Initiative Conference in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia and became the first robot to receive legal personhood in any country. "I am very honored and proud of this unique distinction. This is historical to be the first robot in the world to be recognized with a citizenship," Sophia said

In November 2017, Sophia was named the United Nations Development Programme's first Innovation Champion, and is the first non-human to be given a United Nations title.

Sophia could do many things like humans. She is able to make drawings, including portraits. In 2021, her self-portrait was sold for nearly \$700,000 at auction. Sofia is also very active on social media. She has over 200.000 followers on social media platforms like X and Facebook.
