





All in a Day's work

Many people do not like their jobs. The two most common reasons are low pay and boredom. Other reasons are terrible bosses or co-workers, long working hours, and bad working conditions. Perhaps the real problem is that many people just aren't able to find the right jobs. Workplace magazine interviewed 200 university students in New York and Los Angeles to find out what their ideal job would be. Their answers revealed some distinctly different <u>attitudes</u> toward work. We identified six basic types of people:

<u>The company person:</u> "I want to have job security and would like to work for the same company all my life."

Only eight percent of the students in our survey fit into this <u>category</u>. It seems that not many expect a job for this life these days. Decades ago, it was common for a person to work with one company for their entire life. Now, working for the same company for a lifetime does not happen very often. In today's workplace, people are likely to change jobs frequently throughout their life.

The idealist: "I want to save the world."

Seventeen percent of students in the survey fit into this group. Several students said they wanted to help endangered species of animals. Others said they wanted to go to Africa to help people.

<u>The wealth-seekers</u>: "I want to earn lots of money, and I don't care what I do to get it."

Twenty-one percent were mainly motivated by making money. Their goal was to get rich. Many wanted to be presidents of big businesses or have their own companies. They were prepared to work long hours and were not particularly interested in having a life outside work, such as getting married and raising a family.

The fun-seekers: "I want a job that won't take over my life."

This attitude was the most common view that students in the survey expressed. Thirtyone percent of the students said their *priority* was to balance life and work. They said they did not want to work 10 to 12 hours a day, six or seven days a week. They wanted interesting jobs, but they also needed time for family and enjoying life.

The part-timers: "I do not want to work every day. Life is too short."

Twelve percent said their dream jobs would allow them to work part-time. That way, they said, they could travel and do other things they really enjoy.

The clueless: "I have no idea what I want to do."

Eleven percent of the students belonged in this final category. They said they really had no idea about what their dream job would be. They said would move from job to job until they found the right one.



- Rick Chowdhury, thirteen, talks with a confidence which would have been impossible nine months ago. "I interviewed the chief executive of the football Association, Graham Kelly," he says. Rick and his fellow reporters wanted to do an article on him. "We did the research in a group and thought of the questions together. Then we wrote up the article. "Before joining, Rick had been getting average marks in English. "My English in school has really improved and so has my reading. Each time I do an interview I become more sure of myself."






