**Interviewer:** What do children do in these camps?

**Teacher:** Oh they learn to do many things such as skiing, swimming, climbing mountains it depends on the timing of the camp. Cooking is the only thing they have to learn in all the camps.

**Interviewer:** How much do these camps cost?

**Teacher:** 200 dollars for the first one. The second is longer it is around two weeks so it costs 350.

**Teacher:** As it is the longest it costs 500 dollars.
