Read the sentences and find out the differences between them.

Sentence 1

I can speak Italian very well
but I can't speak French.



Here we describe ability in the present.

Sentence 2

I could swim, but I couldn't ride a
bike when I was nine years old.



Here we describe ability in the past.

Now look at the underlined words. What type of words are they?

They are modal verbs.

What does the word ability mean?

Ability means “ power or skill to do something”. If you have the ability to do something, it means you can do it.

Example:

You can play with Amy after you do your homework.

ability in the present

When I entered the room, I could hear something scratching.

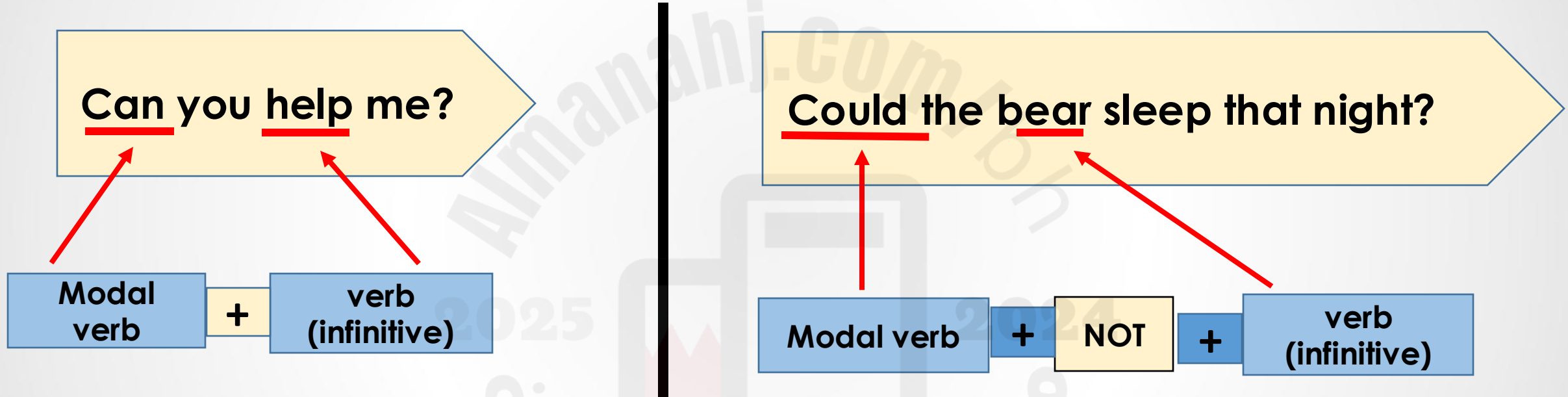

Usage

We use can: to talk about ability in the past.

Rule: Yes/ No questions



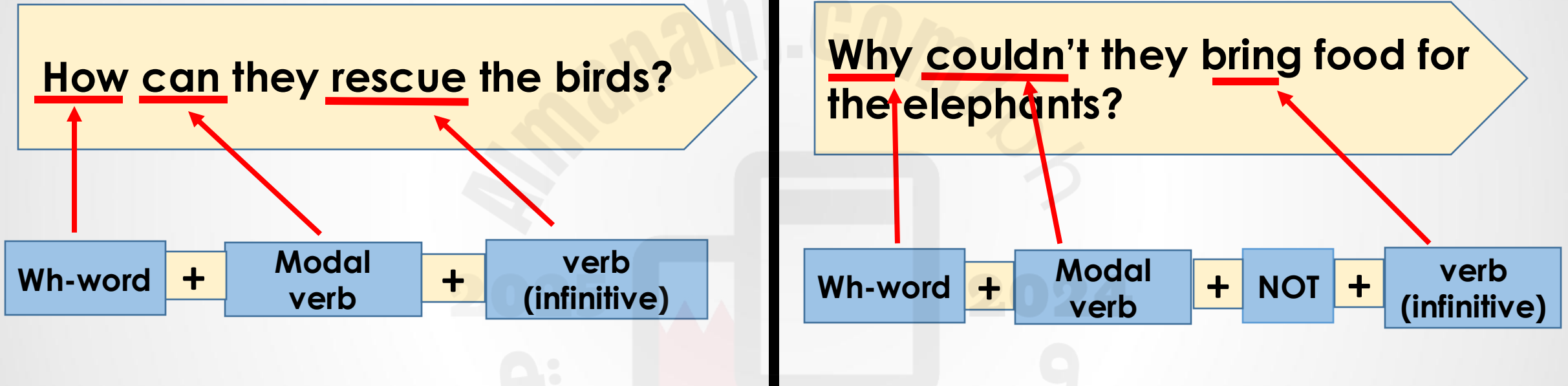
The answer:

Yes, I can. Or No, I can't.

The answer:

Yes, it could. Or No, it couldn't.

Rule: Wh-questions



The answer is a full sentence.

They can put a guard in the forest to protect them.

They couldn't bring food because it was raining heavily.

Compete the sentences with can or can't and the verb in brackets
