

The city of Manama is a unique place in the heart of the Arabian Gulf. It is the capital city of the Kingdom of Bahrain. Manama is in the north-eastern corner of the country. Manama is an important trading centre in the Arabian Gulf. As a result, this modern city is surrounded by some of the most amazing architecture of the area, which merges the old and modern life of the city. There are wonderful skyscrapers and traditional villages. There is an eye-catching tower which has the shape of a twisted glass building.

Another unusual building, is the twin towers of the Bahrain Financial Harbor (BFH), which are a symbol of Bahrain's efforts to save the environment through reducing the use of energy. This tall structure is 240 m. (787 ft.) high and is the first skyscraper in the world to integrate wind turbines into its design. The weather in the winter is pleasant. But it can get hot in the summer, with temperatures reaching up to 40°C. Because of its high temperatures, Manama offers a lot of indoor activities. Such as an indoor water park, and amazing playing areas. The residents of Manama can enjoy a variety of outdoor activities. They could visit one of the malls in Manama or the Manama Souq where you can buy some of the finest Bahraini gold and have a taste of traditional Bahraini sweets.

What is archaeology? Imagine an archaeologist. What do they do? Do they look for an adventure? Dig for treasures? Is it a good career? Being an archaeologist is an unusual profession. They do dig to find artefacts from the past but that's not where their job finishes. They study them as clues to find out about people who lived in the past. The artefacts don't tell them their story, instead they have to piece it together themselves. At times, they take risks when they work in dangerous sites.

How does archaeology work? Do archeologists work in an office? Actually, sometimes they do. They have passion for what they do. They study these artefacts as they peak out of the ground, they start to ask questions on site. Let's explore an artefact to find answers. For example, they would find bones at a site in the city. It's much bigger than most animals, but it's so light. What could it be? It must be from a sea creature. Its size and weight tells them it's a whale! They must consider all the reasons to why whale bones are found in the middle of the city. Archeologists would clean and preserve the bones. Perhaps the whale found its own way up and got stuck. Or someone brought the bones there. What do you think? Do you think the whale got lost? We'll probably never know the real answer but it's exciting to imagine what could have happened and ask so many questions about a city's past. What will you discover next time you visit a museum?

Adventures Near and Far

Jimmy Chin is an American climber, photographer, and Academy Award winning film director.

You are more likely to find Jimmy commuting to Mount Everest than to an office. He organised many dangerous climbing trips to China, Pakistan, Nepal, Greenland and more. He takes photographs and videos in some of the most amazing –but dangerous- places on Earth. His achievements include climbing and photographing the world's highest mountains in Nepal, Tibet and Pakistan. Why does Jimmy do such difficult work in such extreme places? He replies, 'Creating films and photographs in situations that few other could experience is my life's inspiration.'

Kevin Hand is another example of explorers working in extreme places. Kevin is a planetary scientist.. He drills through the ice in northern Alaska and the Arctic Ocean to study microscopic life in the water underneath it.

'I hope that studying microscopic life under ice on Earth will help me to find and study life under the ice on Jupiter's moon, Europa' he says.

He also works with directors as a scientist advisor for films, such as Europa Report. Kevin has even been in a film. He was a featured scientist in the film 'Aliens of the Deep'.

Sunrise and sunset control many of our daily activities, from when we eat breakfast in the morning to when we go to sleep at night. But what happens to us if the sun never rises? Or if it never sets? It's an annual occurrence for residents who live in or near the Arctic Circle, when summer can bring months of almost constant sun and winter can blend into one long period of darkness.

In the darkness before the dawn, I dive into the ocean to observe the amazing creatures that live there. Seventy-one per cent of Earth is ocean, and much of it is dark, with tones of life down there that we don't know about.

I discovered that many sea animals can see colours in the water that we can not. So I designed a camera that allows me to see the colours just as a fish does. This camera shows a secret world of neon green, red and orange colours on ocean life that glows in the dark.




