#### Listening: Part1

A. Listen to a conversation between Emma and James. Put (T) for true sentences and (F) for false ones. You will hear the recording twice.

You have two minutes to read the questions. [pause]

Now we are ready to start. Listen carefully. You will hear the recording twice.

James: Hi Emma, how are you?

**Emma:** Oh! Hi James. Where have you been? I haven't seen you for a week?

**James:** Yeh. I visited my family. Look! This is a photograph of my family at my cousin's birthday party.

**Emma:** Oh! Who is the woman with the light hair and blue eyes, James?

James: That's my mum. Her name is Charlotte and next to her is my aunt, Anna. She's an actress.

Emma: Really? I don't know. I have a feeling that I saw her somewhere.

James: Yes. She has small roles in plays, but she really wants to appear in films and on TV. She wants to be a film star.

Emma: And who's this?

- James: That's my sister, Katie. She's at university. She studies languages -Spanish and French. She's on holiday in Italy at the moment with some friends.
- **Emma:** Ooh! Is that pasta there? I really like Italian food. Who's next to your sister?

James: That's my brother, Sam. He's 18.

Emma: He's got light hair and blue eyes just like your mum!

James: I know. Katie and Sam both look like my mum, while I look more like my dad. That's him there. He's a vet.

Emma: Wow! My mum's a vet, too. She wants me to become one, but I want

to be an artist.

James: I'm no good at art. I want to become an author and write books.

Emma: You write really well. I read all your articles in the school newspaper.

**James:** I do short stories as well. Do you want to read some?

**Emma:** Yes, please. I like to read in my free time. And I will tell you my opinion after.

James: I appreciate that. It would be so nice of you.

Listening: Part2

You will hear an interview with a TV cameraman Jeff Carter. Fill in the missing information in the numbered space with one word OR numbers ONLY. You will hear the recording twice. You now have two minutes to look at Part2. [ pause] Now we are ready to start. Listen carefully.

**S:** Today in our show we have Jeff Carter a TV cameraman. Hi Jeff, how are you?

J: Hi Sara. I'm doing well.

#### S: When did you decide that you wanted to become a cameraman?

**J**: Well, when I was ten, my father took me to my first football match. It wasn't a very exciting match so I spent most of the time watching the cameraman at work. I found his work so fascinating! Millions of people would watch the match later on in the evening.

#### S : So, how did you get started?

J: I wrote a letter to a TV station and took part in a training course. It was really interesting and they thought I was quite talented, so after six weeks, they gave me a job.

#### S: What was your first job?

**J**: It was to shoot a local tennis match, and to be honest, I didn't do a very good job. Luckily, I didn't get fired, but it was good for me because I always learn a lot from my mistakes. My work improved a lot in the first year or so. But I soon got bored of doing sports.

#### S: So, what did you decide to do next?

**J**: Well, I really wanted to travel. I had a friend who travelled a lot with the news. But that can get very dangerous in certain countries.
