1	Mary and George, a retired couple, want to go on a short walk that lasts about an hour. They like old houses and pretty countryside but can't climb steep hills.
2	The Thompson family want to spend a day out, including lunch. The parents like visiting gardens but aren't interested in country houses. The two children are very active and like animals.
3	Carolina and Juan are experienced, independent walkers. They would like a long walk followed by a meal in a traditional restaurant. Although they like attractive old villages, they don't enjoy crowded places.
4	Kenzo would like to join an organised walk to learn about the area. He is interested in history and wants to see one of the best-known places in this part of the country.
5	Belinda and her young teenage son Tom both enjoy being outdoors. Belinda Wants to go walking and then find a nice café to relax in. Tom gets bored just walking and prefers other activities, especially sports.

A	Strines You need to be used to walking to successfully complete this seven-hour walk through the wildest scenery in the area. Follow a little-known footpath to the highest point for miles. The traditional restaurants down in the village serves hot food from 12.00 daily.
B	Howden Lake This two-hour walk attracts thousands of visitors. When the water is low, you can see a village which was flooded 300 years ago. Quiet café with beautiful views. Children can go sailing and windsurfing on the lake with trained instructors.
С	Devonshire Park Take a really enjoyable walk in the countryside surrounding the park. Allow at least half a day, or make it a full day by visiting the adventure playground and farmyard (both great for young children). Stop at the café (open all day) or enjoy the fantastic gardens, with beautiful fountains. Guided walks available for small groups.
D	Stanton This walk is definitely for very fit walkers only - the tracks get very slippery after rain. Allow six hours and start early! You're unlikely to meet another person all day. Fantastic views of farmland in the valleys below. Be sure to pack sandwiches - you'll be up on the hilltops all day.
E	Hope Village A leisurely way to spend an hour or two is by visiting the busy village, of I-lope with its lovely old cottages, traditional restaurants and country gardens. A gentle walk towards the hills will soon bring you to superb views.
F	Langsett After a steep climb, this is an exciting walk along easy paths, which are crowded a weekends (people come from all over Britain to climb Langsett). The views are dramatic, and it's a popular place for family picnics. Guided walks start from the nearby village (10 am Sundays) and visit 800-year-old woodland and ruins dating back two thousand years.

Exploring the Arctic

The Arctic is one of the few places in the world untouched by pollution where you can see nature at its wildest and most beautiful. Join our ship the Northern Star from 2 to 18 July, for a 17day voyage to the Arctic. During the voyage you are able to relax and get away from it all. There are no parties or firm-shows to attend, quizzes to enter, or entertainers to watch.

However, we do have specialists on board who are willing to answer any of your questions about the Arctic and who will talk about the animals and birds that you see on the trip. After setting off from Scotland, we go north along the coast of Norway to Bear Island. Along the way you'll see thousands of seabirds and wonderful scenery, with rivers of ice and huge cliffs. You will have the chance to see reindeer, polar bears, and other Arctic animals. Although we have a timetable, experience has shown that we may have to change our direction a little, depending on the weather and on which animals appear.

The Northern Star is a very special ship and our past voyages have been very popular. Our cabins all have the same excellent facilities, which include a private bathroom and refrigerator. Our chefs are happy to prepare any food for people on special diets. Choose just what you want to eat from the wide variety available from the dining room buffet. There is a library, shop, clinic and plenty of space for relaxation. If you need some exercise, why not go jogging every morning around the decks, or do some swimming in the indoor pool.

Prices include economy class air travel and 16 nights on board the Northern Star, all meals and excursions and all lectures.

Day 1 Board the Northern Star.

Days 2-7 We sail slowly north along the coast of Norway, stopping at places of interest.

Day 8 Tromso.

You need to get up at sunrise to see the whales as we sail towards Troms. Visit Tromso to see the Arctic Museum, the cathedral, and the beautiful old wooden houses. In the evening we sail away along the west coast to Bird Island, which is excellent for bird-watching.

Days 9-10 Bear Island.

We arrive here in the early evening and stay overnight. Bear Island once had an active fishing industry, but today little of this remains. We will explore the island, looking out for Arctic flowers.

Days 11-16 Spitsbergen.

A place of mountains and rivers of ice, it is home to a large variety of animals.

Day 17 Leave the ship in Spitsbergen and fly to London from Tromso.
