Emily had a normal childhood until she was eighteen months old, when her parents noticed that she was walking strangely. They thought it was a simple problem that could be solved easily. However, Emily didn't get any better. They went to every hospital and medical centre they knew, but none of the doctors could identify what was wrong. Finally, after over six months of this, a doctor discovered that Emily was suffering from 'SMA'.

SMA is a rare disease that destroys the nerves controlling muscle movement. This affects a child's ability to use his or her muscles, especially for standing or walking. It is very rare because both parents have to be carriers of the abnormal gene to have a child with SMA. Emily's parents are both perfectly healthy and had no idea that they were carrying this harmful gene.

Now, at the age of five, Emily can crawl around using her arms and uses a wheelchair when necessary. She still enjoys activities like swimming. Until now, scientists are still looking for a medicine to help children with SMA. Emily's parents still have hope that one day their daughter will be able to walk.




