The Indian Rupee is the official currency of India. It is issued by the Reserve of India. The rupee is subdivided into 100 paise. The symbol for the Indian Rupee was adopted in 2010. The reverse side of Rupee banknotes shows amount in 15 of India's official languages. In India, currency paper is made of cotton. It is not a paper but a cloth with look and feel of paper. Rupee coins are made of several metals such as copper, silver, zinc and aluminum. It is very easy to produce coins. The Indian rupee notes have two sides.
