**General notes:**

- All content must respect Islamic and Qatari culture and values.
- Number of options per SR item is mandatorily four (three distractors & a key).
- Texts or test items must neither be literally copied from the learning resources nor taken from previous exams.
- Use the provided test template for the design of your test.
- Abide by the DOK levels as per the “model/answer key document” provided.

**Listening:**

- Listening assessment should include 1 audio recording with a time span of 2-3 minutes, and it is to be played only twice.
- Quality of audio recording must be observed in terms of pace, accent, sound level, clarity... etc.
- Listening source / hyperlink must be mentioned in the test’s model/key answer document.
- Order of listening comprehension questions in the test paper must follow the sequence of ideas as per the recording.
- Audio recording must be saved in MP3 / MP4 format.

**Speaking:**

- The language functions section must test students’ ability to communicate in different situations. It must not be confused with grammar.
- The language functions questions must be aligned with the corresponding speaking topics/standards in the learning resources.
- Speaking ORAL assessment should take place before the written test.
- Speaking ORAL assessment grading should be based on the rubric provided by the Educational Supervision Department.



**Reading:**

**Part 1: Comprehension:**

- Reading assessment must include 1 reading passage with a word count of 300-350 for grade 10 and 350-400 for grade 11.
- Reading source / hyperlink must be quoted in the test's model/key answer document (placed above the reading text).

**Part 2: Vocabulary:**

- Vocabulary items must ONLY test new vocabulary introduced in the "Vocabulary" sections.
- It is mandatory to use a "stimulus" for vocabulary items.
- The CR vocabulary items must be of "word formation" and "gap filling" types.

**Writing:**

- Students must be given 2 writing prompts, from which they are to choose only one to write on.
- Prompts must be different from the ones tested in the mid-term exams.
- Prompts must be of two different types, and must be different from the reading passage topic, to avoid copying.
- Prompts must not be identical to the ones in the resources, though they must be of the same type and ideas.
- Grading of writing response must be based on the writing rubrics provided.
