1 This is Salem. Don't tell anyone about Mike: my tiger. However, let me tell you a few facts about tigers. Tigers are the third largest land carnivores. Tigers have many qualities. Not only they are large, but they are also fast and so beautiful. Tigers can sprint as fast as 40 miles per hour for short distances and leap as far as 30 feet horizontally. You might not think that such large, fast, and ferocious creatures need help to survive, but they do.

2 Despite all the tiger's strengths, the future of the species is uncertain. Tigers face a very high risk of **extinction**. It is estimated that at the start of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, there were over 100,000 tigers living in the wild. By the turn of the century, the number of tigers outside of captivity decreased to just over 3,000. Those captive tigers need to be trained to possess the necessary skills of living in the wild to be set free afterwards.

3 Interestingly, the most serious threats that tigers face come from humans. Humans have done considerable damage to the world's tiger population through hunting, but perhaps more damage has been caused through the destruction of habitat. Tigers are hunted for many reasons. People have long valued the famous striped skins. Though trading tiger skins is now illegal, they are worth around \$10,000 on the black-market. Tigers have also been hunted as game. In other words, people hunt tigers solely for the thrill and achievement of killing them.

4 Though tiger population faces many threats, there have been some successes in conservation and preservation efforts. There are some signs that show that humans are interested in protecting tigers. Organizing Campaigns, funding researches and establishing reserves are some instances. For example, Save China's Tigers, an organization working to restore the wild tiger population, successfully rewilded a small number of South China tigers, 35. It is not a question of having food only. Tigers need a new home. Now, their number has become 130.
