

The famous writer Khalil Gibran was born in 1883 in Lebanon. He has many books for example The Prophet, The Madman, Broken Wings, Sand and Foam ... etc. Many of his books made into movies such as The Prophet and the Broken Wings. In 1902, he lost his older half-brother and his mother the following year. He was forced to leave his secondary education, because he was sent to the Collège de la Sagesse in Beirut.

In 1905, Gibran's first published written work was A Profile of the Art of Music, in Arabic, by Al-Mohajer's printing department in New York. His next work, Nymphs of the Valley, was published the following year, also in Arabic. After a long time in New York, he travelled to Paris. He lived there for some years. In 1910 Gibran sailed back to New York City from Amsterdam October 22 and was back to Boston by November 10.

Many of Khalil's works were set in New York and Paris. In his works, he talked about the development of his country in the 20th century. Most of his writings were fragments of conversation, short stories, fables, political essays.

Khalil worked hard in his life. He spent most of his time to his excellent work and working for his country. That's the reason why he was busy most of his time. He died in New York in 1931.




