General Remarks: Tests must be built on the test specifications.

- O The test should address the key standards stated in the modules covered in the 2nd semester overviews. (Grades 7 & 8: modules (5 & 6) Grade 9: modules (6 & 7)
- Question types allowed are SR (selected response) and CR (constructed response).
- **O** DOK levels must be maintained as prescribed in the specification charts.
- O Language Functions, Vocabulary & Grammar items should simulate the items of the textbooks.
- O Enrichment materials are not to be included in the test.
- O Copying and pasting from the resource (Portal to English), or the Test CD into the test is Not Acceptable.

Listening Section

- O Listening items should cover at least TWO standards, including the one on the main idea (L1.1).
- O Students should listen to the audio TWICE.
- O The audio must be around 2 minutes long.
- The listening audio must be clear with a moderate pace.
- O Allow Students some time (2 to 3 minutes) to read the items before they start listening.
- Listening source / hyperlink must be mentioned in the answer key.

Speaking Section

- Speaking items should be taken from the language functions handled in the target modules.
- The oral Exam must be assessed according to the speaking rubric.

Department of Educational Supervision

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Reading_Section:

- Reading items should cover at least THREE standards, including the one on the main idea (R1.1).
- O Don't penalize the student's response in the reading CR items section for any of the writing mechanics (structure, spelling or punctuation).
- CR items in reading section should use only Wh-question words (when-where-what-who-how-why-which) and should ask for information stated (DOK 1) or inferred from the text (DOK 2).
- The word count of the text should be as follows: G.7 (150 200) G.8 (200-250) G.9 (250-300).
- Vocabulary items should be taken from the 'vocabulary sections' handled in the target modules.

Writing Section

- Grammar items should be taken from the key topics handled in the target modules.
- Each CR grammar item should have 2 requirements or could be divided into 2 sub items each scored ½.
- Students SHOULD organize their responses in separate paragraphs (2 3 short paragraphs): Students will be penalized for NOT using PRAGRAPHING.
- Students are given 2 writing prompts to choose only one. (Topics handled in Modules 5 & 6 (for grades 7 & 8), and modules 6 & 7 (for grade 9)
- Prompts must not be identical to the ones in the resources, though they must be of the same type.
- Grading of writing response must be based on the writing rubric provided.

Test Style:

- The font-size must be Calibri 14 in all test questions.
- Closely follow the test template issued by the English Supervision Department Office for this purpose.
- Leave enough space between the items. (4 to 5 items on each page).
- The SR items should have 4 choices, placed vertically.
- The score for each section should be placed on the student's test paper.
- If the choices are single words with acute difference in length, they are organized lengthwise. If not; alphabetically.
