French Fries

French fries are one of the most common food around the world . French fries are long, thin pieces of potato fried in oil or fat . Vegetables oil is the best fat to make amazing fries . French fries are served hot, either soft or crispy, and are generally eaten as part of lunch or dinner or by themselves as a snack, and they commonly appear on the menus of diners and fast food restaurants. French Fries are usually salted and, depending on the country, may be served with ketchup, mayonnaise or tomato sauce.

To achieve golden-brown perfection, you have to fry them twice: first at a low temperature, to poach them; then at a high heat, to crisp them up. Actually , French fries are better when cooked at restaurants .Some people got addicted to French Fries because they don't need a fork or spoon to eat them . They can eat French fries with their fingers .

Many restaurants selling French fires frequently combine servings of fries with another food, for example, fried fish or beef burgers.
